- 2) intellectual movement that emphasized the use of reason and the scientific method as means of obtaining knowledge
- 5) person who was contracted to work in the colonies for another for a limited time period
- 7) transfer of the British monarchy from James II to William and Mary in 1688-89
- 8) transatlantic system of trade between Africa, England, Europe, the West Indies, and the colonies of North America
- 10) Spain and Portugal agreed to divide the lands of the Western Hemisphere between them
- 11) economic system in which nations seek to increase their wealth and power by obtaining large amounts of gold and silver and by establishing a favorable balance of trade
- 13) Spanish authorities granted colonial landlords the service of Native Americans as forced laborers
- 15) the voyage that brought enslaved Africans to the West Indies and later to North America
- 16) the establishment of outlying settlements by a parent country

- 1) Virginia Company's policy of granting 50 acres of land to each settler and to each family member who accompanied him
- 3) the transfer of plants, animals, disease, ideas, and technology between the Western Hemisphere and the Eastern Hemisphere
- 4) revival of religious feelings in the American colonies during the 1730s and 1750s
- 6) business in which investors pool their wealth for a common purpose
- 9) colony under the direct control of the English monarch
- 12) member of one of the Puritan groups that, denying the possibility for reform within the Church of England, established their own independent congregations
- 14) members of a group that wanted to eliminate all traces of Roman Catholic ritual and traditions in the Church of England
