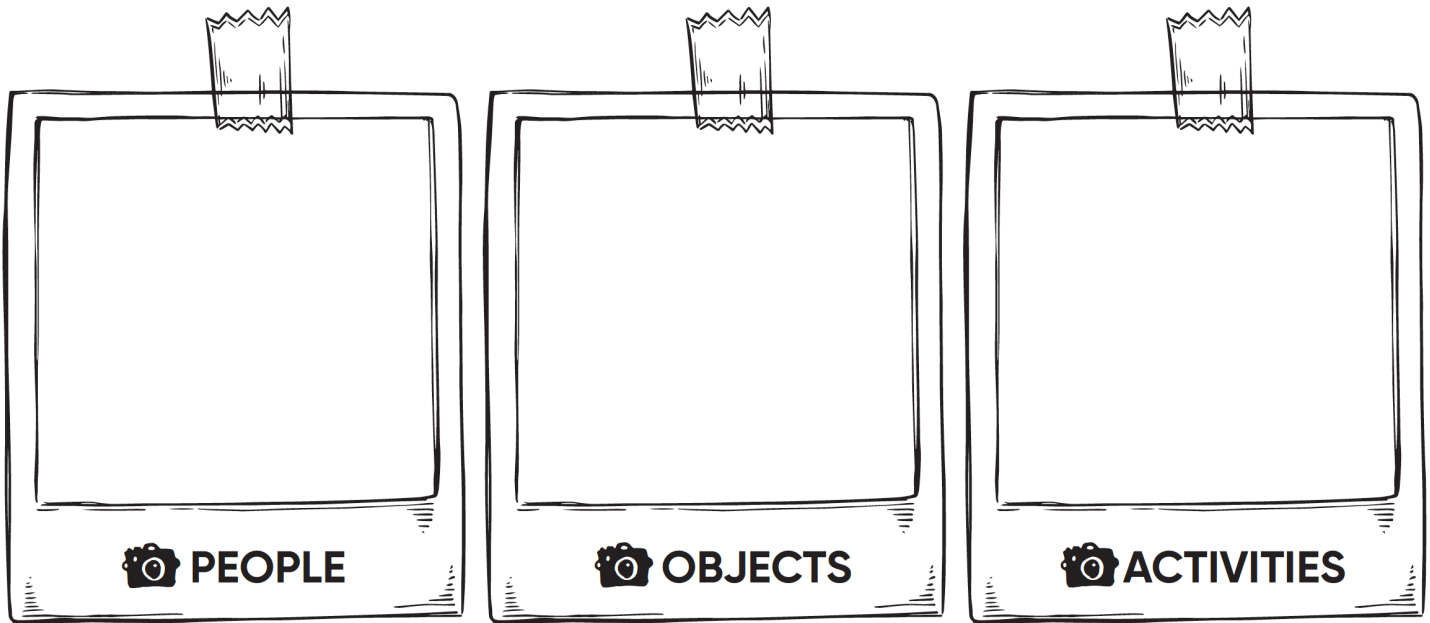


## Skills
