

- 7) Part of the Triangular Trade system on which slaves from Africa were brought to the New World
- 10) American born descendant of Spanish settlers in a Spanish colony
- 11) system where one country extends its control over another area, especially for economic benefit
- 14) person who assumes the financial risk in the hope of making a profit
- 15) representative who ruled one of Spain's provinces in the Americas in the name of the king
- 16) expansion of trade and competition among nations caused by the discovery of the New World
- 18) signed between Spain and Portugal that divided the non-European world between them
